159. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST (IF ANY)

160. REQUEST FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGE VEHICLE EXTENSION FOR FURTHER 12 MONTHS - FM14 LZX,

The Sub-Committee noted the information provided by way of the report. In particular the Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle's MOT certificate expires in September 2025, with no advisories. The vehicle passed its annual taxi inspection test on 12 March 2025 with one advisory. The Applicant was in attendance and confirmed that the vehicle is well maintained due to the mileage it does. It is due to be serviced in two weeks and the advisory will be fixed during this.

The Sub-Committee were satisfied that the vehicle was in a good and sound condition and that public safety would not be compromised by the granting of the licence sought.

Decision

Accordingly, the Sub-Committee granted the Hackney Carriage Vehicle Licence Extension as detailed in the report with the additional condition that the vehicle undergoes six monthly vehicle tests to monitor the condition of the vehicle due to the age of the vehicle and the advisory listed.

161. REQUEST FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGE VEHICLE EXTENSION FOR FURTHER 12 MONTHS - FJ63 ZSZ,

The Sub-Committee noted the information provided by way of the report. In particular the Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle failed its annual taxi inspection test and MOT on 18 March 2025 with three advisories and one major defect and is currently off the road. The Applicant was in attendance and confirmed that the vehicle has had one of the advisory fixed and the remaining ones are due to be fixed the following week. The

major defect was an oil leak and so not obvious to the applicant who will be hiring another vehicle whilst this one is off the road.

The Sub-Committee were not satisfied that the vehicle was in a good and sound condition at this time and that public safety would not be compromised by the granting of the licence sought.

Decision

Accordingly, the Sub-Committee refused to grant the Hackney Carriage Vehicle Licence Extension as detailed in the report as it felt it could not grant a licence extension until the vehicle has a valid MOT and vehicle test as is required by the Council's Taxi and Private Hire Policy. The Applicant was invited to come back before the Sub-committee once he had attained a valid MOT and vehicle test.

162. REQUEST FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGE VEHICLE OVER 5 YEARS - AF18 ZBJ

The Sub-Committee noted the information provided by way of the report. In particular the Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle's MOT certificate expires in April 2025 with three advisories. The vehicle passed its taxi inspection test on 13 March 2025 with two advisories. The Applicant was in attendance and answered questions put to them by the Sub-Committee. It was confirmed that this was to be a spare vehicle and the advisories would be fixed and the service light is no longer on. The Applicant will show the Licensing Officer proof of this if required.

The Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle's age was over the Council's policy for licensing new vehicles but considered that it had met all requirements other than age. As such the Sub-Committee felt they should deviate from the Council's Taxi and Private Hire Policy in this particular circumstance as they were satisfied that the vehicle was in a good and sound condition and that public safety would not be compromised by the granting of the licence sought.

Decision

Accordingly, the Sub-Committee granted the new Hackney Carriage Vehicle Licence as detailed in the report with the additional condition that the vehicle undergoes six monthly vehicle tests to monitor the condition of the vehicle due to the age of the vehicle.

163. REQUEST FOR PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLE LICENCE FOR VEHICLE OVER 5 YEARS - YTT 70

The Sub-Committee noted the information provided by way of the report. In particular the Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle's MOT certificate expires in February 2026 with no advisories. The vehicle passed its taxi inspection test on 18 February 2025 with one advisory. The Applicant was in attendance and answered questions put to them by the Sub-Committee. It was confirmed that this vehicle was purchased over a new model as the engine is a better quality compared to the newer model and so should last longer and be more reliable. The Applicant confirmed that the chip in the windscreen was small, but it is due to be fixed.

The Sub-Committee noted that the vehicle's age was over the Council's policy for licensing new vehicles but considered that it had met all requirements other than age. As such the Sub-Committee felt they should deviate from the Council's Taxi and Private Hire Policy in this particular circumstance as they were satisfied that the vehicle was in a good and sound condition and that public safety would not be compromised by the granting of the licence sought.

Decision

Accordingly, the Sub-Committee granted the new Private Hire Vehicle Licence as detailed in the report with the additional condition that the vehicle undergoes six monthly vehicle tests to monitor the condition of the vehicle due to the age of the vehicle.

164. LOCAL GOVERNMENT (ACCESS TO INFORMATION) ACT 1985 - EXCLUSION OF PRESS AND PUBLIC

165. APPLICATION FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGE DRIVERS LICENCE

The applicant attended the meeting in person and was supported by their agent. Arising from consideration of the report, evidence presented and in accordance with the Council's procedure for hearings, it was moved by Councillor Rollason and seconded by Councillor Hayes, and

RESOLVED that the Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence be refused under Section 59 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, in order to promote public safety due to the conduct of the Driver as set out in the Report. The Sub-Committee felt there was reasonable cause to support its view that the driver is not currently a fit and proper person to hold such a Licence.

Reasons for the decision:

Members noted the information set out in the Report and heard from the Licensing Manager that this was a new application, not a review of any previous decision. The Applicant had previously held a Hackney Carriage Driver's licence with Teignbridge District Council until February 2024, when this had been revoked following a review due to complaints about the driver's behaviour. The Licensing Manager confirmed there are no offences on the DBS check and that all relevant information had been included within the report.

The Applicant's agent spoke and referred to the reasons for the revocation of the Applicant's previous licence. Whilst the Applicant should have been aware of the need to use the meter at the time and should have listened to the Licensing Officers, he is now aware of the need for this to be engaged, even for jobs with a quoted price.

The Applicant then spoke and explained that the customer who had videoed him during the altercation was known for not paying and being drunk. The customer had previously refused to pay three times and so the Applicant had asked for the money upfront, this was not given and so the customer was refused. The customer then paid and when being driven by the Applicant was physically abusive, the Applicant did not know he was being videoed. The Applicant admitted he had made a mistake and got angry because of this abuse but this would not happen again if his licence was granted.

The Applicant's agent then continued and noted that whilst not a consideration to be taken into account, losing the licence had had a large impact on his finances and family. The Applicant has taken time since the licence revocation to consider the issues raised, had reflected on his attitude and is aware that the Licensing Authority should be listened to if unsure of the rules. The Applicant had been a taxi driver for 5 years and no longer works for the company. They have their own business and will also avoid working nights if the licence is granted in order to avoid confrontation.

In response to questions by the Sub-Committee as to what had changed since the revocation of the licence as it appeared there had been more than one conversation about the Licensing Authority's concerns, the Applicant explained that they did not think the rules had been explained properly by the Licensing Authority they had received nothing in writing following meetings about the concerns raised and had thought that these would be raised direct with the previous employer.

The Applicant stated they had received no formal warnings and the first they had known about the concerns was when they were told the previous licence would be reviewed at a Sub-Committee. When asked by the Sub-Committee whether they understood their rights and responsibilities as set out in law and the Council's Taxi and Private Hire Policy the Applicant's agent confirmed that a CCTV system had been fitted to the Applicant's vehicle and they had also had several discussions with the Applicant about their responsibilities and what is expected of a person in a position such as this.

The Committee thanked the driver for appearing before them and for answering their questions. However, all factors combined meant that the Sub-Committee did not consider that the driver was a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

The Sub-Committee were concerned that the Applicant had previously been driving for some years but had not appeared to realise the responsibilities of a taxi driver and was still relying on their agent to explain these. The Sub-Committee considered that driver behaviour is paramount and that it had not been an isolated incident but repeated incidents that had caused the previous licence to be revoked. The Sub-Committee noted that passage of time since revocation is a consideration but not the only one.

The Sub-Committee did not feel that the Applicant had shown any real evidence as to how they had changed since their licence was revoked other than being told by their agent how they should be behaving and the Sub-Committee did not feel they had received any proper assurances as to how incidents would be avoided in the future, especially as there had been a repeated pattern of behaviour.

The Sub-Committee did not feel comfortable granting a licence purely to give the Applicant a chance to show they had changed as this could potentially put members of the public at risk should an incident happen again. It appeared that the Applicant was relying purely on the passage of time to support their application and had not done any real work to improve on the behaviours that had led to the revocation of the previous licence.

Licensing and Regulatory Sub-Committee (20.3.2025)

Applying the test of whether Members of the Sub-Committee would be happy for a person they cared about or a vulnerable person to travel alone in a vehicle with the driver, it was concluded after significant deliberation that they would not. The Sub-Committee noted its overriding duty to the public, and of the importance of protecting the public and of public safety and considered that, on balance, there was cause to show that the driver was not a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

The Sub-Committee therefore considered given the circumstances of this case that it be reasonable and proportionate to refuse to grant the driver's application for a new Hackney Carriage Driver Licence at this time.

167. MINUTES

The Minutes of the meeting held on 12 February 2025, were unanimously approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

168. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST (IF ANY)

None.

169. APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION TO A PREMISES LICENCE – DARTMOOR WHISKY DISTILLERY LTD, THE OLD TOWN HALL, BOVEY TRACEY, TQ13 9EG

The Applicant attended the meeting and was permitted to speak and answered questions put to them by the Sub-Committee. Those who had submitted representations also attended the meeting and were represented by a Spokesperson.

Arising from consideration of the report, evidence presented and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 Statutory Guidance, and the Council's Licensing Policy, it was moved by Councillor Hayes and seconded by Councillor Dawson, and

RESOLVED that the Variation to a Premises Licence in respect of Dartmoor Whisky Distillery Ltd, The Old Town Hall, Bovey Tracey, TQ13 9EG be granted as set out in the report including the conditions previously agreed with Environmental Health but with an amendment to the opening hours requested to 10am-00.00am with the supply of alcohol to end by 11.30pm.

Reasons for the decision:

The Sub-Committee heard from the Licensing Manager who explained that the application had been submitted to vary the current opening hours of the premises from the current 10am-11pm to 10am-00.30am with the supply of alcohol and provision of

regulated entertainment to finish at midnight. In response to questions the Licensing Manager confirmed no official complaints had been received since 2019 and the Distillery has been licensed since 2016.

The Licensing Manager explained that after consultation with Environmental Health conditions had been agreed with the Applicant to amend the live and recorded music times to finish at 11pm every day and add a condition that windows will be closed when live or recorded music is played. Noise levels will also be monitored and recorded outside as set out in the detailed conditions.

The Applicant was permitted to address the Sub-Committee and confirmed that he had already fitted blackout blinds which assist with soundproofing as well as keeping windows and doors closed. The doors are being converted to being on an automatic closing system. He also has a handheld decibel monitor which is used to make sure levels are below the maximum legal level.

The Applicant continued and confirmed that signs have been put up to remind customers to keep noise levels down when outside and a new security system has been installed with the recordings held for 12months. These will be available for inspection if required.

The Applicant then stated that other establishments have later opening licences and hold noisy events with seemingly no objections, but it seems that this premises is being singled out by a handful of people.

In answer to Member's questions the Applicant confirmed that the decibel meter is handheld and is checked every 30 minutes. There had been complaints directly to the Applicant, but these were all from those who had submitted objections. The Applicant also confirmed he had sent a letter to the community to discuss matters prior to submitting the application but that only a handful had turned up. The Applicant then explained that he had been in business for 10 years. No food is served at the premises, but customers are actively encouraged to bring in takeaways, as other pubs do in the area, but all rubbish is disposed of by the Applicant and there are bins for customer's use as well.

The Applicant has spent a lot of money soundproofing, but as the building is Grade II listed there is a limit to what can be done. On average there are 1 or 2 occasions of live music a month, the rest of the time the premises is run as a normal bar. The premises is also let to charities for fundraising events. The decibel levels have been measured and come in below the recommended limit from Environmental Health.

The Objectors' spokesperson was then allowed to speak and confirmed that the main concern is that of public nuisance. The Objectors feel that the extended licensing hours are excessive and unreasonable and that the present licence is reasonable and tolerable for those who live in the vicinity of the premises.

The Objectors have complained to the Applicant on several occasions about excessive noise and there is concern that due to the Applicant advertising more, coupled with the increase in hours, the residents will face even more disruption.

The Spokesperson admitted that the conditions agreed with Environmental Health made them more comfortable with the application and appreciated that work had been done by the Applicant to deal with the issues being raised, such as the new window blinds. They added that if the licence were to be granted, they would also request that closed doors should be included as a condition along with the previously agreed windows when live music is played.

The Spokesperson continued and confirmed that other venues which have similar hours to the ones being requested do not cause a problem as they play music less frequently, often only in the afternoons and are smaller, so less people leave at the same time. The premises has a lot of strings to its bow as a distillery such as hosting coach tours and tastings amongst other events and so it is not felt it is comparable to other premises within the area.

The Spokesperson continued and noted that whilst music levels will stop at 11pm under the agreed conditions, there is still the noise of the customers leaving the Premises which will not be stopped by this condition, therefore the later premises licence is not suitable.

In response to further questions the Applicant confirmed the venue holds around 70 people, although usually only 40-50 people are there at any one time. The later licence will allow the Applicant to clear up and customers are likely to stagger their leaving times as opposed to all leaving at once. The decibel levels will be recorded in a book which will be available for inspection. Groups outside are also encouraged to move on and stop congregating outside of the premises and smoking is also discouraged.

The Sub-Committee having considered the application submitted and having heard from those present and being mindful of Statutory Code of Guidance and Licensing policy, felt that on balance it could not refuse this application but did feel that an amendment to the licensable hours were appropriate in order to mitigate the level of public nuisance that may be increased by the longer opening hours.

The Sub-Committee felt that the Applicant had shown they were willing to work with neighbouring properties to mitigate the points raised by the Objectors, such as by installing door closures and agreeing conditions with Environmental Health to reduce the hours that music would be played. The Sub-Committee also noted that none of the other Statutory Authorities had objected to the variation request.

The Sub-Committee further considered that there had been no official complaints received by the Licensing Authority despite the allegations of public nuisance but noted that the Applicant had confirmed he had received complaints directly about the noise levels.

The Sub-Committee felt that even though the Objectors live in the vicinity of licensed premises, they are still entitled to peace in their homes and understood their concerns should the hours be increased and subsequently the numbers of people making noise at a later time increases. The Sub-Committee noted that the Objectors felt noise levels had not been well managed to date and so were concerned as to how the Applicant would remedy this going forward.

Licensing and Regulatory Sub-Committee (14.4.2025)

However, the Sub-Committee felt that the Applicant had shown he was willing to work with neighbours to mitigate their concerns having already installed noise and light reducing measures along with agreeing conditions with Environmental Health.

Taking all matters into consideration the Sub-Committee were satisfied that the Applicant was suitably experienced and would be able to promote and uphold the four Licensing Objectives and deemed it appropriate to grant the variation of the licence as set out in the report including the conditions previously agreed with Environmental Health. However, the Sub-Committee felt that an amendment to the opening hours requested was reasonable and these should be set at 10am-00.00am with the supply of alcohol to end by 11.30pm in order to reduce and mitigate the level of public nuisance to the surrounding neighbours.

1. APPLICATION DETAILS

1.1 Vehicle first registered – 9 December 2019 Age of vehicle, if granted - 5 years and 4 months

The vehicle does not meet the Council's licensing policy as it is over 5 years of age.

1.2 MOT expires – 8 December 2025 with the following advisories:

Repair as soon as possible (minor defects):

- Windscreen wiper blade defective (3.4 (b) (i))
- Nearside Front Suspension arm ball joint dust cover severely deteriorated (5.3.4 (b) (i))

Monitor and repair if necessary (advisories):

- Nearside Front Outer Tyre worn close to legal limit/worn on edge (5.2.3 (e))
- Nearside Rear Inner Tyre worn close to legal limit/worn on edge (5.2.3 (e))
- 1.3 Vehicle inspection 3 April 2025 with one advisory near side front lower ballpoint dust cover deteriorated.

1.4 Licensing Officer:

At the time of writing this report the vehicle had not been inspected by a licensing officer.

Recommendation:

Whether to grant a licence or not. If the Committee resolves to license the vehicle, a condition can be imposed requiring the vehicle to have six or four monthly vehicle inspections.

2. RELEVANT POLICY AND LAW

2.1 Paragraph 5.2 of the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Licensing Policy states that:

A vehicle being presented for initial licensing is required to be under five years old at first registration.

- 2.2 All vehicle licences are issued annually.
- 2.3 Section 48(4)(c) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states that:

'Every licence granted under this section shall— (c) remain in force for such period not being longer than one year as the district council may specify in the licence'.

2.4 Section 48(2) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states that:

'A district council may attach to the grant of a licence under this section such conditions as they may consider reasonably necessary including, without prejudice to the generality of foregoing provisions of this subsection, conditions requiring or prohibiting the display of signs on or from the vehicle to which the licence relates.'

- 2.5 The above Policy and statutory provisions reflect the Council's responsibility to ensure that all hackney carriage and private hire vehicles are safe and fit for use by members of the public. The Committee has the discretion to license a vehicle if it is of the view that the vehicle is safe, fit for use and is in an acceptable condition.
- 2.6 The decision of the Committee following a complete review of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy in April 2009, after taking into account the views from the trade, were as follows:

"The Committee decided that vehicles being presented for initial licensing must be under five years old."

2.7 Section 50(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides:

'that a district council shall not under the provisions of this subsection require a proprietor to present the same hackney carriage or private hire vehicle for inspection and testing on more than three separate occasions during any one period of twelve months.'

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of defending the appeal if the application is refused and the applicant appeals to the Magistrates' Court.

4. LEGAL

The Committee are required only to ensure that Public Safety is not compromised by the granting of the licence. If they are satisfied that safety is reasonably assured, they may grant the licence for a maximum of 12 months or such shorter period as they see as appropriate.



Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to apply for a Hackney Carriage licence for my vehicle, registration number FG69 YHU, within the Teignbridge District. I believe my vehicle meets and exceeds the council's standards for licensing, and I would like to highlight the following points in support of my application:

Vehicle Age and Compliance: My vehicle was first registered in September 2019, making it approximately 5 years and 6 months old. Teignbridge District Council's policy requires vehicles to be under 5 years old at the time of first registration. While my vehicle is slightly older than this requirement, I believe its exceptional condition warrants consideration.

Mileage and Condition: As of its last MOT, the vehicle had recorded 88,000 miles, which is considered low for its age. This low mileage is indicative of reduced wear and tear, contributing to its excellent mechanical condition. The vehicle has been meticulously maintained, with a full-service history available for review.

MOT and **Safety Compliance:** The vehicle has consistently passed all MOT inspections without any advisories, demonstrating its adherence to safety and environmental standards. Copies of the MOT certificates can be provided upon request.

Comfort and Accessibility: The interior of the vehicle is in pristine condition, offering passengers a comfortable and pleasant experience. It is equipped with modern amenities to ensure safety and convenience for all users.

Conclusion: I acknowledge that my vehicle exceeds the standard age requirement by a few months. I respectfully request that the council consider these factors and grant an exemption based on the vehicle's merits.

1. APPLICATION DETAILS

1.1 Vehicle first registered – 2 March 2006
 Age of vehicle, if granted – 19 years and 2 months
 Private Hire licence expired – 8 April 2025

The vehicle will no longer meet the Council's licensing policy as it is now being more than 10 years old.

- 1.2 MOT expires 7 October 2025 with no advisories.
- 1.3 Vehicle inspection passed on 3 April 2025 with no advisories.

1.4 Licensing Officer:

At the time of writing this report the vehicle had not been inspected by a licensing officer.

Recommendation:

2. RELEVANT POLICY AND LAW

2.1 Paragraph 5.2 of the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Licensing Policy states that:

A vehicle being presented for initial licensing is required to be under five years old at first registration.

A vehicle being presented for subsequent licensing is required to be under 10 years old with the exception of purpose built cabs. The Council has discretion to continue to licence Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicles which are older than ten years provided that the Council is satisfied that the vehicle is in a good condition and good state of repair and provided that it passes the appropriate testing standard. Applications for subsequent licensing for vehicles older than ten years will be considered by the Regulatory and Appeals Committee which can impose such conditions as it thinks fit including six and four monthly testing'.

- 2.2 All vehicle licences are issued annually.
- 2.3 Section 48(4)(c) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states that:

'Every licence granted under this section shall— (c) remain in force for such period not being longer than one year as the district council may specify in the licence'.

2.4 Section 48(2) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states that:

'A district council may attach to the grant of a licence under this section such conditions as they may consider reasonably necessary including, without prejudice to the generality of foregoing provisions of this subsection, conditions requiring or prohibiting the display of signs on or from the vehicle to which the licence relates.'

- 2.5 The above Policy and statutory provisions reflect the Council's responsibility to ensure that all hackney carriage and private hire vehicles are safe and fit for use by members of the public. The Committee has the discretion to license a vehicle if it is of the view that the vehicle is safe, fit for use and is in an acceptable condition.
- 2.6 The decision of the Committee following a complete review of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy in April 2009, after taking into account the views from the trade, were as follows:

"The Committee decided that vehicles being presented for initial licensing must be under five years old."

- 2.7 With regard to subsequent licensing, the Committee decided that a vehicle should be under ten years old with the exception of purpose built cabs. However the Committee decided that the Council could exercise discretion to continue to licence Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicles which are older than ten years provided that the Council is satisfied that it is in a good condition and good state of repair and provided that it passes the appropriate testing standard. Applications for subsequent licensing for vehicles older than ten years will be considered by the Regulatory and Appeals Committee which can impose such conditions as it thinks fit including six monthly testing. The Committee did not consider it appropriate to introduce an upper age or mileage limit."
- 2.8 Section 50(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides:

'that a district council shall not under the provisions of this subsection require a proprietor to present the same hackney carriage or private hire vehicle for inspection and testing on more than three separate occasions during any one period of twelve months.'

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of defending the appeal if the application is refused and the applicant appeals to the Magistrates' Court.

4. LEGAL

The Committee are required only to ensure that Public Safety is not compromised by the granting of an extension of the licence. If they are satisfied that safety is reasonably assured they may grant the licence for a maximum of 12 months or such shorter period as they see as appropriate.

- 2.6 The decision of the Committee following a complete review of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy in April 2009, after taking into account the views from the trade, were as follows:

"The Committee decided that vehicles being presented for initial licensing must be under five years old."

- 2.7 With regard to subsequent licensing, the Committee decided that a vehicle should be under ten years old with the exception of purpose-built cabs. However, the Committee decided that the Council could exercise discretion to continue to licence Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicles which are older than ten years provided that the Council is satisfied that it is in a good condition and good state of repair and provided that it passes the appropriate testing standard. Applications for subsequent licensing for vehicles older than ten years will be considered by the Regulatory and Appeals Committee which can impose such conditions as it thinks fit including six monthly testing. The Committee did not consider it appropriate to introduce an upper age or mileage limit."
- 2.8 Section 50(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides:

'that a district council shall not under the provisions of this subsection require a proprietor to present the same hackney carriage or private hire vehicle for inspection and testing on more than three separate occasions during any one period of twelve months.'

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of defending the appeal if the application is refused and the applicant appeals to the Magistrates' Court.

4. LEGAL

The Committee are required only to ensure that Public Safety is not compromised by the granting of an extension of the licence. If they are satisfied that safety is reasonably assured, they may grant the licence for a maximum of 12 months or such shorter period as they see as appropriate.

### 1. APPLICATION DETAILS

1.1 Vehicle first registered – 5 March 2012
 Age of vehicle, if granted - 13 years and 2 months
 Hackney Carriage licence expires – 16 May 2025

The vehicle will no longer meet the Council's licensing policy as it is now being more than 10 years old.

- 1.2 MOT expires 1 March 2026 with no advisories.

#### 1. APPLICATION DETAILS

1.1 Vehicle first registered – 19 March 2013Age of vehicle, if granted - 12 years and 2 monthsHackney Carriage licence expires – 18 May 2025

The vehicle will no longer meet the Council's licensing policy as it is now being more than 10 years old.

1.2 MOT expires – 9 May 2025 with minor defects and advisories.

## Repair as soon as possible (minor defects)

• Windscreen damaged but not adversely affecting driver's view [3.2 (a) (i)] **Monitor and repair if necessary (advisories)** 

- (Coolant below min)
- Brake disc worn, but not excessively Front [1.1.14 (a) (i)]

- 1.3 Vehicle inspection and MOT booked at the Depot on 7 May details to be provided prior to the hearing.

## 1.4 Licensing Officer:

At the time of writing this report, the vehicle had not been inspected by a licensing officer.

## Recommendation:

If the Committee resolves to license the vehicle, a condition requiring the vehicle to have six or four monthly vehicle inspections be imposed.

#### 2. RELEVANT POLICY AND LAW

2.1 Paragraph 5.2 of the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Licensing Policy states that:

A vehicle being presented for initial licensing is required to be under five years old at first registration.

A vehicle being presented for subsequent licensing is required to be under 10 years old with the exception of purpose-built cabs. The Council has discretion to continue to licence Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicles which are older than ten years provided that the Council is satisfied that the vehicle is in a good condition and good state of repair and provided that it passes the appropriate testing standard. Applications for subsequent licensing for vehicles older than ten years will be considered by the Regulatory and Appeals Committee which can impose such conditions as it thinks fit including six and four monthly testing'.

- 2.2 All vehicle licences are issued annually.
- 2.3 Section 43 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 provides that:

'Every licence so to be granted shall be under the common seal of the commissioners, if incorporated, or, if not incorporated, shall be signed by two or more of the commissioners, and shall not include more than one carriage so licensed, and shall be in force for one year only from the day of the date of such licence, or until the next general licensing meeting, in case any general licensing day be appointed by the commissioners' and

2.4 Section 47(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides that:

'A district council may attach to the grant of a licence of a hackney carriage under the Act of 1847 such conditions as the district council may consider reasonably necessary'.

2.5 The above Policy and statutory provisions reflect the Council's responsibility to ensure that all hackney carriage and private hire vehicles are safe and fit for use by members of the public. The Committee has the discretion to license a vehicle if it is of the view that the vehicle is safe, fit for use and is in an acceptable condition.

- 2.6 The decision of the Committee following a complete review of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy in April 2009, after taking into account the views from the trade, were as follows:
  - "The Committee decided that vehicles being presented for initial licensing must be under five years old."
- 2.7 With regard to subsequent licensing, the Committee decided that a vehicle should be under ten years old with the exception of purpose-built cabs. However, the Committee decided that the Council could exercise discretion to continue to licence Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicles which are older than ten years provided that the Council is satisfied that it is in a good condition and good state of repair and provided that it passes the appropriate testing standard. Applications for subsequent licensing for vehicles older than ten years will be considered by the Regulatory and Appeals Committee which can impose such conditions as it thinks fit including six monthly testing. The Committee did not consider it appropriate to introduce an upper age or mileage limit."
- 2.8 Section 50(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides:

'that a district council shall not under the provisions of this subsection require a proprietor to present the same hackney carriage or private hire vehicle for inspection and testing on more than three separate occasions during any one period of twelve months.'

#### 3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of defending the appeal if the application is refused and the applicant appeals to the Magistrates' Court.

#### 4. LEGAL

The Committee are required only to ensure that Public Safety is not compromised by the granting of an extension of the licence. If they are satisfied that safety is reasonably assured, they may grant the licence for a maximum of 12 months or such shorter period as they see as appropriate.

The licence is due to expire 18th May 2025 and will be 12 years and 2 months. The vehicle is in excellent condition inside and out.

The cost of replacing vehicles with ones under 5 years old in this current financial climate has risen considerably. This vehicle is only just over 12 years old and has a lot more mileage in it for use as a taxi.

I hope that the committee will look favourably upon my request.
