3.8 Licensing & Regulatory Committee

3.8.1 Membership: The committee has 11 members who are elected councillors who are appointed at the Annual Meeting of Full Council. Only non-Executive Members are eligible. The committee is politically balanced. The Chair or the Vice-Chair of the Committee will, if in attendance at a sub-committee (comprising up to 3 members of the Committee) dealing with licensing applications and / or appeals, chair the sub-committee; otherwise the sub-committee will appoint a chair for the meeting. Up to three substitute members may be appointed by each political group (see paragraph 3.13 for requirements).

3.8.2 Areas of Work: Within its specific terms of reference below, the committee may appoint sub-committees to deal with its business and wherever possible these will be politically representative, the chair of such being appointed by the sub-committee.

3.8.3 The committee's responsibilities comprise:

- (a) All statutory licensing functions of the Council;
- (b) To hear and determine on behalf of the Council (via its sub-committee), any application or appeal within the committee's terms of reference; and
- (b) To consider and recommend to Council on all matters concerning licensing policy and procedure.

3.8.4 In undertaking its work:

- (a) The proceedings of the committee and any sub-committee shall be conducted with regards to its relevant statutory licensing functions in accordance with the applicable legislation; and
- (b) There is no automatic right for a Teignbridge Councillor to address sub-committee hearings. Councillors wishing to do so must follow the due process for making relevant representations set out in relevant legislation (e.g. Licensing Act 2003).

21. REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY

The committee heard from the Licensing Manager who went through the report and explained that the consultation had now closed and the proposed changes to the Statement of Licensing Policy since it last came before the committee were in red. It should be noted that the top line amendment from the police should be ignored as this was already included in the report. Appendix B sets out fully the changes following the consultation.

Cllr Peart noted there appeared to be a typo of the word 'those' on pg.27. Questions were also asked in relation to Devon County Council's involvement and if they are consulted. The Licensing Manager confirmed they were and had received

no comments from them. The new government licensing reforms were also mentioned by Members, but the Licensing Manager confirmed these were still at consultation stage and as such are not relevant at the moment.

There were no further questions from Members and the work done by officers to get the document to this stage was noted by the committee.

It was proposed by Cllr Hayes that the policy as set out in the report be recommended to Full Council for approval. This was seconded by Cllr Rollason.

Members voted unanimously and:

PART I**RECOMMENDATION**

That the Licensing and Regulatory Committee considers a request from the trade for a 10% increase to the Tariff and Tariff 2 to commence at 21:00 pm.

1. PURPOSE

The Council sets the fares that can be charged to customers by Hackney Carriage drivers. The Council has received a request from the trade for an increase to the current tariff which has not been increased since 2022. Following this request the Licensing Team put the increase proposals to the trade of 10% and Tariff 2 commencement at 21:00 pm using Survey Monkey. The results are set out in the body of the report.

It is an offence under Section 67 of Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 (the Act) to charge more than the metered fare in a hackney carriage.

The Council is required to publish a notice in a local newspaper setting out the proposed fares or the variation of fares. The notice must specify the date that the new fares are to come into force, and this date must not be less than 14 days from the date of the notice. This notice must also be displayed at the Council Offices. The notice should also give the address for receipt of objections to the proposed fares. The Council is required to consider any objections to the proposals.

The tariff was previously increased by 10% and commenced 19th August 2022.

2. BACKGROUND

Section 65 of the Act allows for the Council to set the fares for Hackney Carriage vehicles; however, the Council is not responsible for setting the fares for Private Hire Vehicles.

A full consultation with all 312 drivers took place in April 2025.

The summarised results of the consultation are as follows.

Tariff 1 – Monday to Saturday 7am to 11pm

Tariff 2 – Monday to Saturday 9pm to 7am, all day Sunday and Bank Holidays and from 6pm to 11pm 24 December and 31 December

Tariff 3 – 11pm on 24 December to 7am 27 December and 11pm on 31 December to 7am on 2 January.

Please note these calculations may vary slightly when finalised for meter calibration.

4. CONCLUSIONS

Only one driver made comment regarding the increase asking for the meter to start on £5 and including the first mile but agreed with the proposal above.

Please note - Drivers do not have to charge the full amount on the meter and do not have to add any extras should they not wish too. The purpose of the tariff is that it is the maximum amount that can be charged.

Less than 32.05% percent of the trade responded, with 95% of those responding wanting an increase. It is extremely difficult to get the opinion of the overall trade when 67.94% did not respond to the survey.

Section 65(6) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states '.... any table of fares previously made under this section for the district, as the case may be, shall cease to have effect.'

There remains a financial implication for the trade of approximately £36.00, including VAT, to have the meter calibrated to a new tariff.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

If the request is granted the Committee are asked to authorise the proposal to be advertised. Should any additional comments be received, the matter may need to be reconsidered by the Committee. If no additional comments are received the new fare will take effect. The cost of printing tariff and contacting all drivers. The cost of advertising the proposed tariff increase is approximately £1075.20.
