Devon and Cornwall Police	Section 15 – to explain more clearly that Objections to Late TEN' do not lead to a hearing and there is no right of appeal.  Appendix C – To read Devon and Cornwall Police as opposed to Constabulary.	We propose to add this information as suggested in Section15.6  We propose to make this change as stated.

Dawlish Town Council	That local councils be considered a statutory consultee to licensing applications received within the relevant authority's parish boundary.  That local councils be given a right of call-in for licenses where there is legitimate community concern relating to the discharging of the licensees responsibilities.	No action to be taken - This is set by Government and would need legislative change.  No action to be taken - Any parish or town council are able to make representations against applications or even to review a licence. Therefore these provisions are already in place. Our Public Register allows to view what applications are available for public consultation and can be selected by ward.

Portman Group	<p>To consider adding text to encourage businesses to abide by Retailer Alert Bulletins to remove irresponsible products and promotions. Wording to be considered:</p> <p><i>The Portman Group operates, on behalf of the alcohol industry, a Code of Practice on the naming, packaging and promotion of Alcoholic Drinks. The Code seeks to ensure that drinks are packaged and promoted in a socially responsible manner and only to those who are 18 years old or over. Complaints about products under the Code are considered by an Independent Complaints Panel and the Panel's decisions are published. If a product's packaging or point-of-sale advertising is found to be in breach of the Code, the Portman Group may issue a Retailer Alert Bulletin to notify retailers of the decision and ask them not to replenish stocks of any such product or to display such point-of-sale material, until the decision has been complied with. The Code is an important tool in protecting children and vulnerable consumers from harm because it addresses the naming, marketing and promotion of alcohol products sold in licensed premises in a manner which may particularly appeal to these groups.
