Introduction

Funding recipients are required to routinely report on their project outputs and outcomes. There is no requirement to report against all of the output and outcome indicators listed - only those identified as relevant to the activities undertaken.

Purpose of this document

The purpose of this document is to set out the output and outcome indicators for REPF for 2025-26.

As set out in the UKSPF Technical Note for 2025-26, the list of outputs and outcomes has been simplified for 2025-26. This is designed to make reporting streamlined based on simple counts of activity/outcomes.

Each place has flexibility to invest in activities that support rural businesses and rural communities within the context of the Fund's aims. The outputs and outcomes listed are the only ones relevant to REPF.

The following lists of output and outcome indicators can be used for REPF projects to measure the activities that are being delivered with REPF support, and the outcomes that this investment generates. No changes have been made to the units of measurement or definitions. The outputs and outcomes have been grouped by how the indicator would be counted into the following indicator types:

- Business and Community Assets
- Enterprises
- Events and Activities
- People and Users
- Others

Output and outcome data will be collected at UKSPF sub-theme level as set out in the UKSPF Technical Note for 2025-26.
