## **Devon Place Board notes 11.4.24**

At the end of last week, Government announced the allocation of REPF for 2025-26, which is £1,826,589 capital for the DTCCA (excluding Exeter and Torbay and awaiting clarification from DEFRA as to whether these areas could be included). This does not include any funding for management/administration.

TDC provisional allocation is £195,067 capital.

Some guidance has been provided on priorities for the funding (see link below). DTCCA keen to work collaboratively.

## In summary:

In 2025-2026 Rural Fund provides capital funding to:

- support new and existing rural businesses to develop new products and facilities that will be
  of wider benefit to the local economy this includes farm businesses looking to diversify
  income streams but does not support farming/agricultural activity.
- support new and improved community infrastructure, providing essential community services and assets for local people and businesses to benefit the local economy

Notwithstanding any district views in relation to use of this funding, one approach could be to replicate a capital grant scheme across the rural area of Mid Devon, East Devon, Teignbridge, South Hams, West Devon, Torridge, and North Devon. (Please note - This is the default position)

The capital grant scheme could offer grants between £5,000 and £49,999 (tbc) to:

- support micro and small businesses and farm diversification
- rural circular economy projects
- boosting rural tourism
- providing rural services (support new and improved community infrastructure)
- providing cultural and heritage activity

## Initial feedback

- Some concerns raised about a pooled grant scheme and districts receiving their allocation.
- Some have own ideas, including capital projects and extending previous grant scheme e.g. decarbonisation, community resilience grants etc.
- If the allocation is ringfenced to the district, potential for pooled grant scheme.
- Concerns re administrating grant scheme without funding.
- Opportunity for larger value strategic projects e.g. Teign Estuary Trail but councillors might be interested in smaller scale schemes.
- Any opportunity to streamline the grant scheme.

## **Timescales**

- UKSPF and REPF investment plan has to be submitted at the same time. Deadline DCC working towards 30.4.25
- Feedback from districts by 18.4.25

NB Financial Instructions up to £200k Exec approval.

Investment Plan cannot be submitted until UKSPF and REPF agreed, timescale by end of April 25.
